

### **FACT SHEET**

Upopolis® is a therapeutic, safe, and secure online support network for youth living with medical diagnosis or navigating a stressful life event; it aims to help alleviate fear and anxiety, and positively impact outcomes by helping youth to:

### **CONNECT**

 peers with similar experiences and a team of certified child life specialists

#### **LEARN**

 coping skills and access information on procedures, diagnoses, disabilities, and life events.

### **SHARE**

 create/join discussions with other Upopolis members.



## Overview:

Upopolis provides youth across North America with a private, safe, and secure network where they can connect with peers who are having similar experiences e.g., youth with chronic illness, critical illness, their siblings, and youth experiencing grief due to the death of a loved one. This therapeutic online network is comprised of youth aged 10 - 18 years, youth mentors, child life specialists and other professionals.

Upopolis gives youth the opportunity to access resources that are created for them by reliable sources which are vetted by child life specialists. Upopolis also offers programming to foster expression of feelings, processing of information and experiences, the chance to share their experiences and knowledge with others, and more. Upopolis offers "groups" which youth may use to feature personal blogs, private forums to discuss their experiences, hospital specific information and activities for fun and entertainment.

## **About Upopolis:**

Upopolis began in 2007 at McMaster Children's Hospital and has since grown to include a network of 25+ hospitals, health care centres and organizations across Canada – and continues to grow. Each hospital and organization have an opportunity to a space within Upopolis to connect and share information with the youth they refer.


# Upopolis Island:

In 2021, the Upopolis team launched a second private network to provide a place for youth to connect who were navigating stressful life events e.g., grief and sibling illness. Having a second network allows the team to set up groups to better meet the needs of the youth and organizations referring to this community.

# Therapeutic Goals of Upopolis

The therapeutic goals of Upopolis are:

- to provide a safe and therapeutic online outlet for youth with medical diagnosis, their siblings, and youth who have experienced the death of a loved one to connect with one another.
- to promote creativity for youth by allowing them to create their own groups on Upopolis to share experiences and interests with other users.
- to access trusted medical, health and wellness information provided by individual hospitals/clinics/centres that is vetted by health care professionals.
- to encourage youth to express themselves through blogging, group projects, photos, live chats and online activities always with the support and supervision of mentors and health care staff who understand their unique struggles and experiences.
- to enhance the experience of a social support platform to one that is therapeutic and unique in meeting the needs of youth with medical diagnosis or navigating a stressful life event.
